The National Labor Relations Act is the law that governs the relationship between unions, employers and employees. This law puts the power in employees' hands. Among others, it gives you the right to:



Discuss wages, benefits and other work related issues with your co-workers



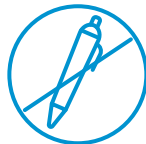
Support a union—try to convince your co-workers a union is necessary



Oppose a union—try to convince your co-workers a union is not necessary



Sign a union authorization card or petition, either paper or digital



Not sign a union authorization card or petition, either paper or digital
